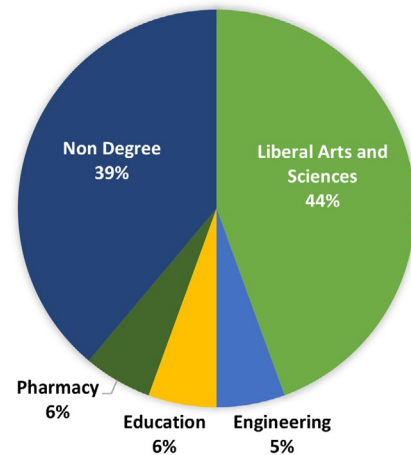

## Graduate Direct Exchange

The Graduate Direct Exchange program provides students with opportunities to pursue non-degree graduate-level studies in their fields. Under the terms of each reciprocal agreement, an enrolled graduate student of KU may study at a partner university during the academic year, while a German graduate student attends KU.

Since the exchanges began in 1967, KU has sent 291 students to partner German universities, and 326 German students have studied at KU.

*The Center supports two ongoing research projects: the Kansas German Dialects project, a digital archive of German-American dialects spoken by immigrants or their descendants living in Kansas, and the Digital Archive of American World War I Poetry, a collaborative project conducted by the KU European Studies Program and Kansas State University. The KU Editorial Branch of the Archive focuses on immigrant poetry.*
